Syllabus¹ - M.A. Programme in German Studies

Programme M.A. in German is open to students who have already earned a B.A. (Hons.) in German. Those who have earned a diploma in German language and have a B.A.(Hons.) in any other subject are also welcome to apply for admissions to this programme. Selection will be done on the basis of rank attained by the candidate in the online entrance exam designed for this programme.

This programme offers courses on a range of subjects like genres of literature, literary movements, and periods in history of literature, translation & interpretation, linguistics, didactics of German Language, the cultural and political history. In final semester students are required to write a dissertation on an area of their choice, thereby providing a basis for an academic career.
